The world is in quite a state as I sit to write my reflection. There is turmoil at every turn. Violence, neglect, bullying, death, destruction is everywhere. It has been part of nearly every conversation that I have had in the past few weeks. There is so little to be said about all of this pain and suffering other than it is tragic and so hard to understand. As I asked God to guide my words to you I received the following response. Turn that frown upside down.
